Natural Resource Committee Chairperson: "Mr. Wills, let me first tell you this before you address this committee: I believe this committee will agree, that if any of us were to run for another office in Texas, we would first get hold of your group of detectorist's in this state; for none of us on this committee has ever witnessed such a huge letter and email campaign in behalf of your Bill in the years we have been in this legislature. Your folks are to be congratulated for their outstanding support of this Bill by far!"

All committee members agreed.

We were assigned a House Bill, number HB 1016, this bill is our House Bill to open Texas State Parks to metal detecting activity across the state. Now is the time to contact your House Rep in your area, and express to him how much you want him to vote "YES" on this Bill. I have a sample letter below that you can use or change into your own words.

So as you can see, in 2001 we blew the Senate Committee and Senators on the floor away with our letter writing. I'm asking for every one of you to help us do this again. If you will write to support this bill to your Senator and House Rep, we will win this fight again, and they will pass our bill. Please take time out and help!

SAMPLE LETTER

Dear Honorable Representative _____

Date: _____

I contact you today to request your support in favor of **HB 1016** Bill in the House. The major facts for voting "YES" on **HB 1016** Bill is that 38 other states in America allow this recreational activity of metal detecting on "pre-disturbed public use areas" of their state parks that have no archeological or historical significance, where we find lost coins and jewelry that many times allow us to return them to the original owner, and at the same time creates a means of physical activity to keep us healthy. This is especially important for our many senior citizens here in Texas. These 38 current states that allow this recreational activity also had the same concerns of protecting our many natural and cultural resources as we do, and as is the duty of the state of Texas. However, these states found a way to co-exist with this activity by designating areas for the activity to be allowed that has no archeological or historical significance; public use areas.

The Army Corps of Engineers has allowed this activity on their lands in "designated public use areas" since 1989 without incident nationwide, which they too have been successful in the protection of their many thousands of significant resources all those years.

Let's not forget that most all Texas County and city parks currently allow responsible metal detecting activities on their properties, and are also able to protect their significant resources and co-exist with the activity. There just is not any reason why Texas cannot also allow this legal, and responsible recreational activity within their state parks.

The Texas Parks and Wildlife have been against it, but allow all other recreational activities and sports on Texas State Parks. This is nothing more than discrimination against our activity, and the many thousands of tax paying folk here in Texas who enjoy the activity for recreational and family purposes.

We request that you please vote "Yes" to **HB 1016**, and allow the people of Texas the use of their State Parks.

Sincere thanks for taking the time out to listen, and considering supporting this Bill. I will be more than happy to discuss this Bill anytime with you.
